## **Upcoming Events at the Post and in Fairport!**

- Friday February 28<sup>th</sup> at 7pm, we will be holding our 2<sup>nd</sup> annual tribute and ceremony for our Desert Storm Veterans. This ceremony will be dedicated to Past Commander Sam Rex. Sam was an Army Veteran who received a Purple Heart and a Bronze Star while serving in Iraq. Unfortunately, Sam lost his hard fought battle with cancer during his time as Commander, so we will again remember him during this ceremony.
- April – Stay tuned as we organize our spring cleanup. This is always weather dependent, so join our Post email list or keep an eye out at the Post for dates and times. We always need a large group of volunteers for this effort!

### **Memorial Day Parade – 2020**

This year for Memorial Day (and also the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade), we will have an altered route due to the Lift Bridge Repairs in the Village. This year's new route will see us line up on Hulbert St. at either Minerva Deland or Brooks Hill Schools. We will march towards 250, turning left and head towards the Village. Once we come up to West Church St., we will make a left and head on to Potter Park where the parade will culminate with our Memorial Day Ceremony. Please either join us along the parade route, at the ceremony at Potter Park and if you would like, we would love to have you march in the ranks with us. All Veterans are welcome to march with us. You do not have to be a Post member.

- May 25<sup>th</sup> – Memorial Day Parade. Just to your left explains our temporary parade route. To all of our members reading this, please consider joining us to march in this parade (and the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade too). Our ranks of those marching thin out more and more every year. If you can march, we'd love to have you. If you have friends who are Veterans, bring them along. All Veterans are welcome to march with us -- you do not have to be a Post Member. I can't say enough about the great reception the community gives us as we march by, but knowing we are out there representing our brothers and sisters who made the ultimate sacrifice is an amazing thing. The bigger our formation the better! If you can, please join us at the Post between 9 and 9:15am. We will then be taken to the parade start (usually in Deuce and a Half's or 5-Ton trucks). After the parade we get back to the Post the same way, although all are encouraged to stay for the Ceremony at Potter Park. After the ceremony we have a picnic at the Post. Please bring a dish to share. I hope to see lots of people at this event!

Last September saw our Post hold yet another successful Golf Tournament. Despite challenges, our golf committee volunteers did an amazing job – headed up by committee Chairman Roy LaRose. 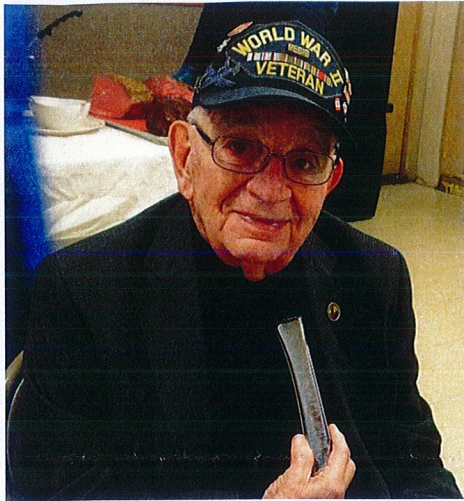
### **Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen**

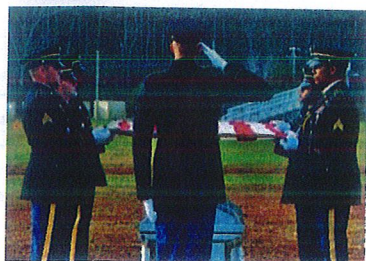
